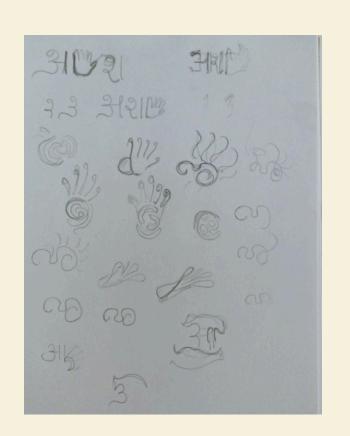

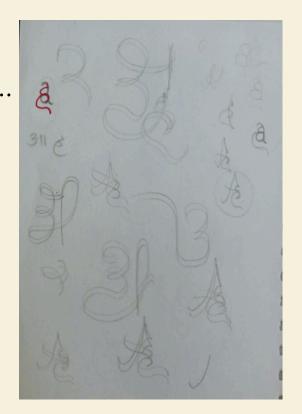

The need for change

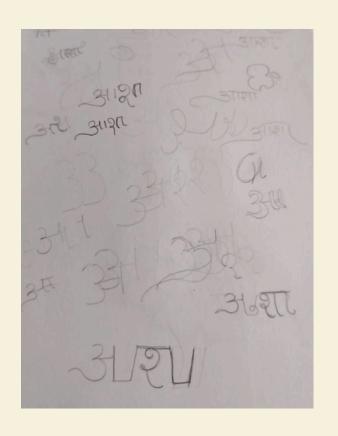

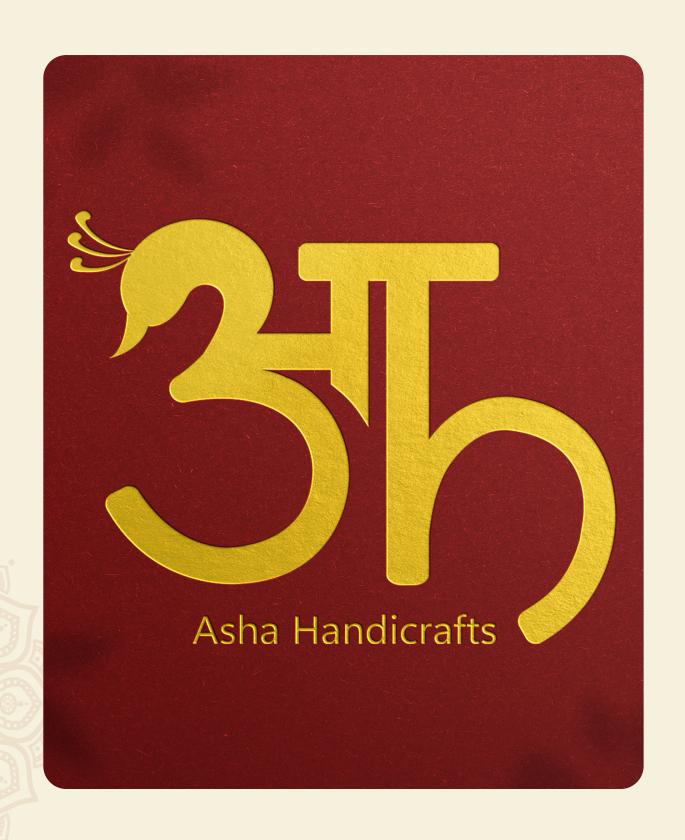




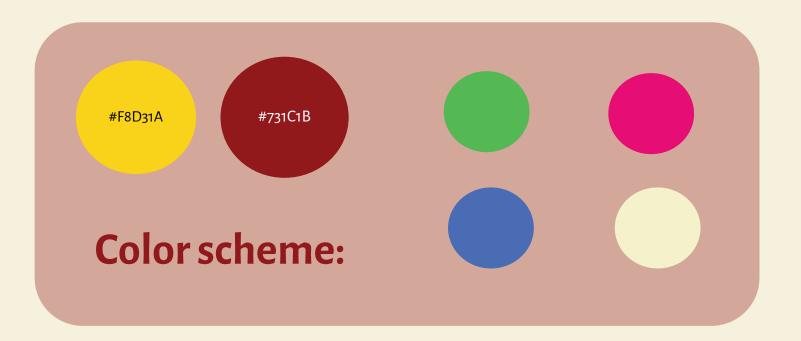




Redesigned logo & color selection



The redesigned logo for Asha Handicrafts celebrates its Indian roots and global reach! It cleverly combines the **Devanagari script** with **English letters.** The beautiful peacock, India's national bird, is a perfect fit. **Peacocks** are a common motif in Indian handicrafts, reflecting the very essence of what Asha Handicrafts cherishes - the **preservation and promotion** of these stunning handmade treasures. Just like a peacock's vibrant feathers, Asha Handicrafts brings the brilliance of **Indian craftsmanship** to the world.



Why this colour palette?

- Maroon: This rich color can represent the deep heritage and cultural significance of Indian handicrafts. It evokes a sense of tradition and sophistication.
- **Yellow:** As highlighted in the brand information, yellow reflects the hope that Asha Handicrafts brings to artisans and the inherent optimism associated with creativity and craftsmanship.

- The logo features the initials of "Asha Handicrafts" combining the Devanagari script and Indian letters, reflecting the organization's dedication to preserving Indian handicrafts. This fusion of characters symbolizes the cultural essence and inclusive nature of Asha Handicrafts' mission.

- The illustration has been incorporated in different elements of our branding and packaging.

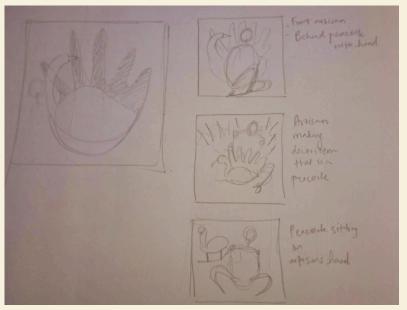


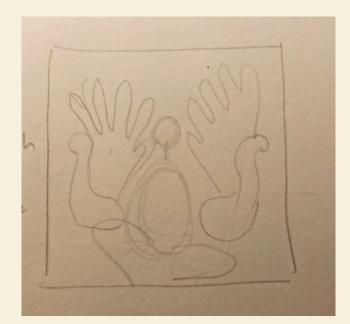
The artisans

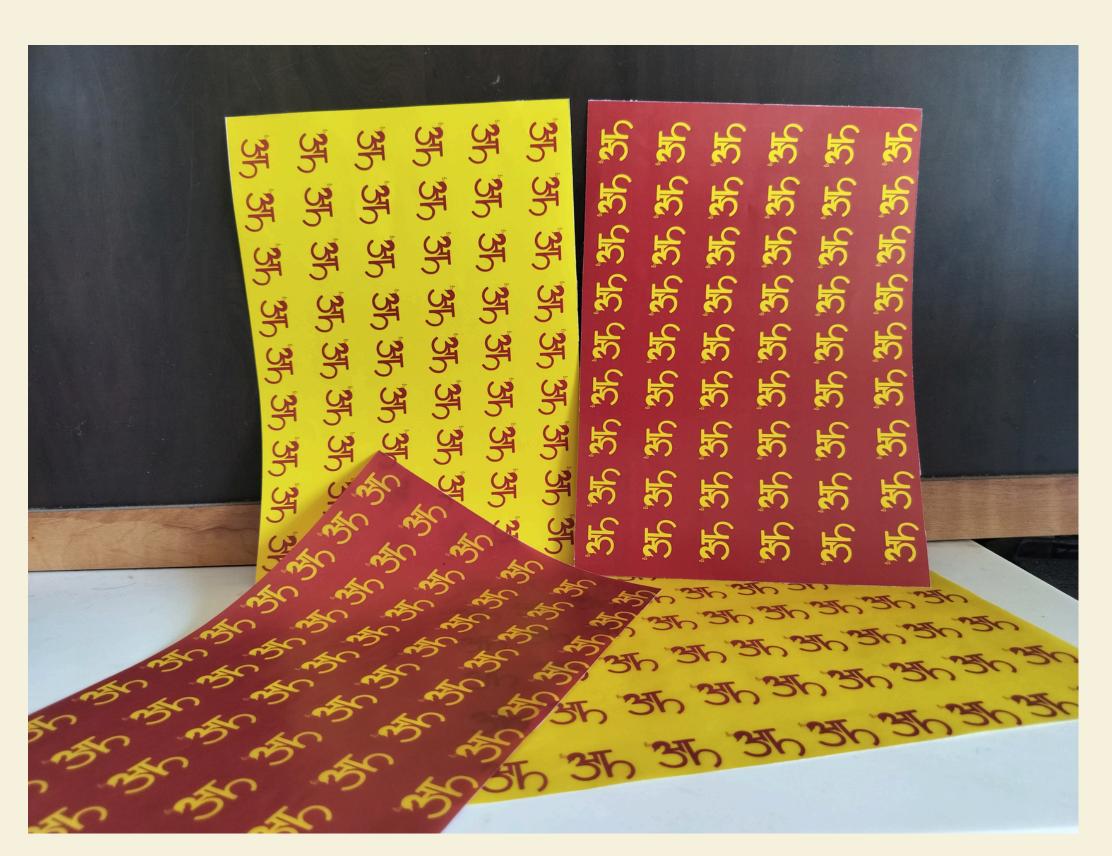

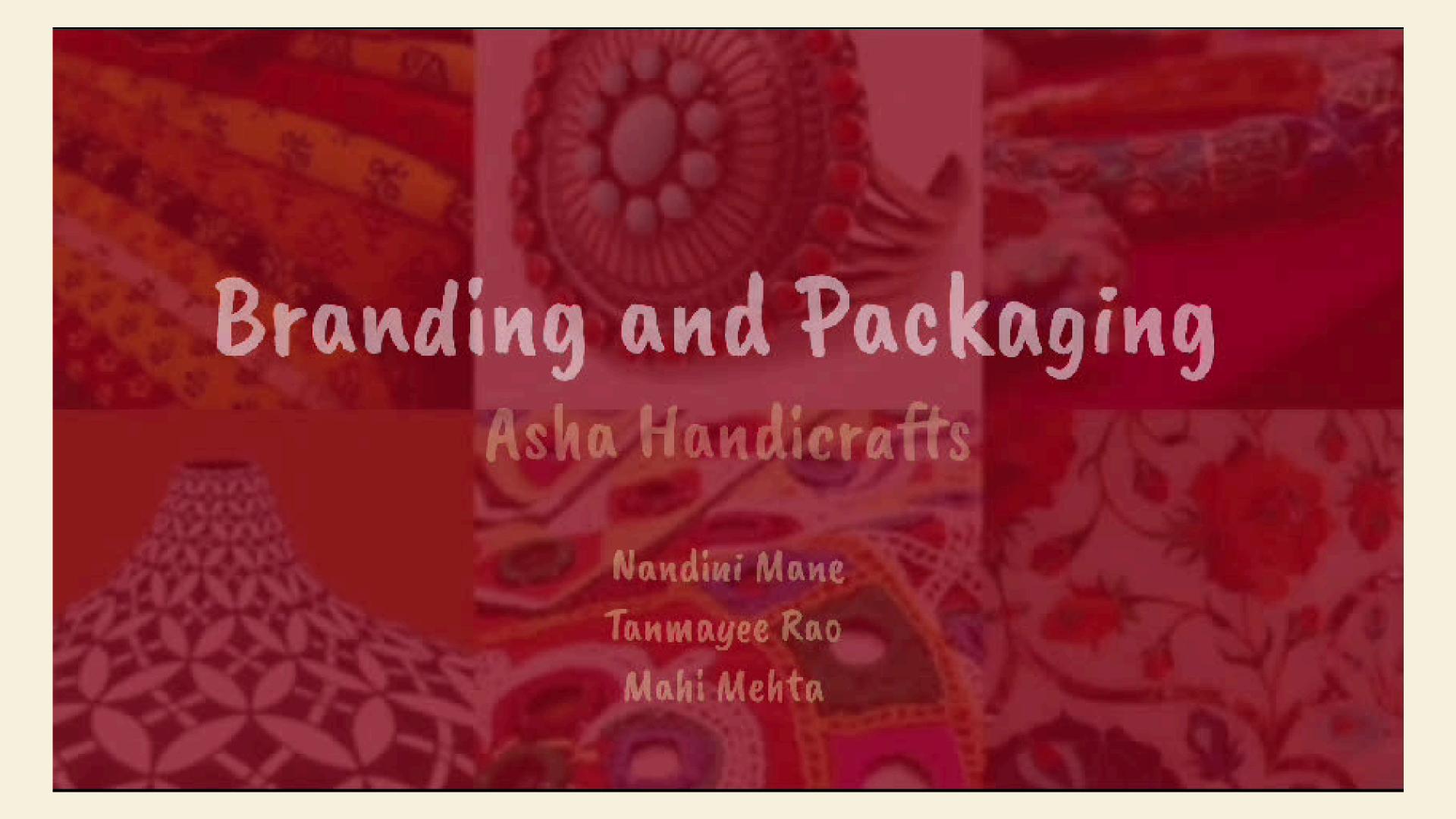
